Man labor @ \$2.80 per hour total, irrigator \$3.20, equipment operator \$3.60 including Social Security and Workman's Compensation Insurance. 90 h.p. crawler per hour cash costs \$7.00, depreciation \$5.00 and interest \$2.50. 120 h.p. 4-wheel drive diesel @ \$4.80, \$2.00 and \$1.00. 70 h.p. wheel diesel @ \$2.95, \$1.04 and 52¢. 50 h.p. wheel diesel \$2.10, \$1.24 and 62¢.
